

### Questions Asked Addendum 1

1. I am not familiar with an imagery content program, so it would depend on how this meets our requirements (resolution, on-prem copy, time-frame, etc.).
2. Our aerial imagery is used for appraising real property on it's condition as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the given year. As such, we need the aerial imagery to be flown as close to January 1<sup>st</sup> as possible to provide an accurate representation as the property was on that date. The final delivery needs to be as soon as possible after January 1<sup>st</sup> (by January 15<sup>th</sup>) so that we have little to no delay in our appraisal methodology.
3. As mentioned in answer 2, we need the imagery to be flown as close to January 1 as possible such that we have an accurate snapshot of that point of time. Prior to Nov. 15<sup>th</sup> leaves a lot of time for a property to potentially change before January 1 and could give us an inaccurate representation of the land and improvements for a particular property.
4. Since we set the property value for assessing taxes, we need aerial imagery flown each year. As stated on page 5 of the RFP *"TERM: The term of the Contract shall be for eight (8) months, commencing on November 1, 2020 and terminating on June 30, 2021 with the said term being capable of extension by mutual written agreement of the parties, unless terminated sooner in accordance with the Contract Documents."*
